

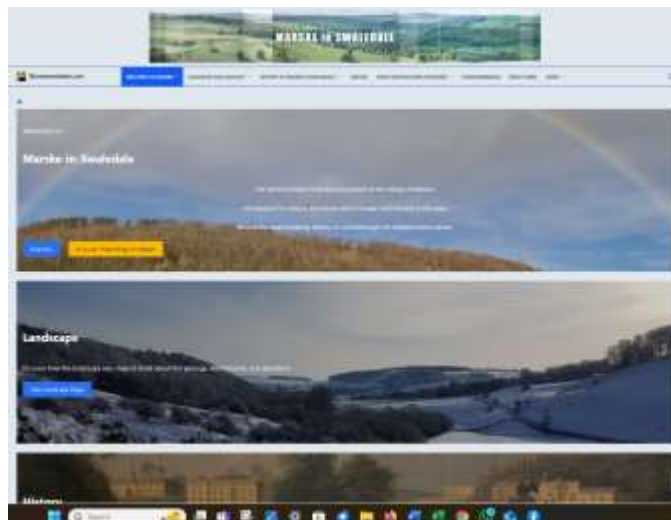

## Item 1:

### The Hutton Cup 1589-90

- **Gift to Elizabeth Hutton (nee Bowes), God-daughter to Elizabeth I**
- **Sold back to Royal family in 1957**

## Matthew Hutton (1529-1606)

- Elizabeth Bowes' father-in-law
- Bought Marske Estate 1590s
- Archbishop of York in 1595
- In favour with Elizabeth I
- The First Marske Archbishop

## Hutton family Around 1900

- Family not living at Marske after late 1800s.
- Last two heirs were John Timothy D'Arcy Hutton II and III.

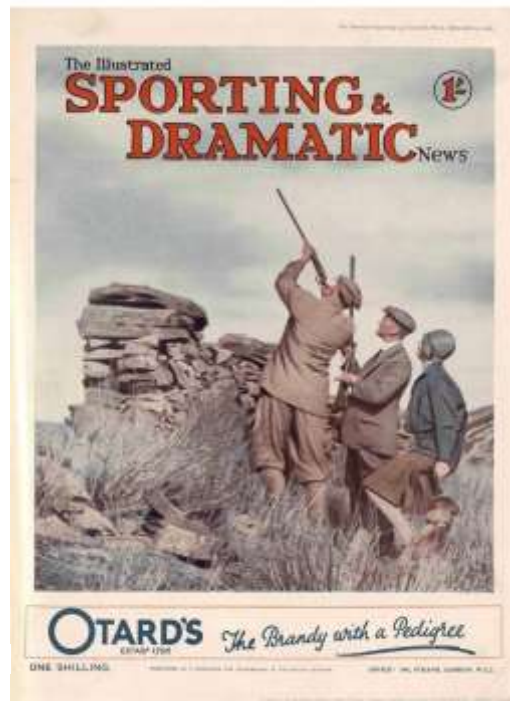

## A new land owner for large parts of the Hutton Estate

- **No one was at home when artillerymen roamed the moors in 1926**
- **Hutton vs Minister of War**
- **Acquisitions in 1926 and 1940.**
- **Reduced Estate by two-thirds.**

- Clints is a collection of buildings  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile from Marske in the woods
- A coach house, orangery, chapel and small cottages
- .. But there had been a manor house here

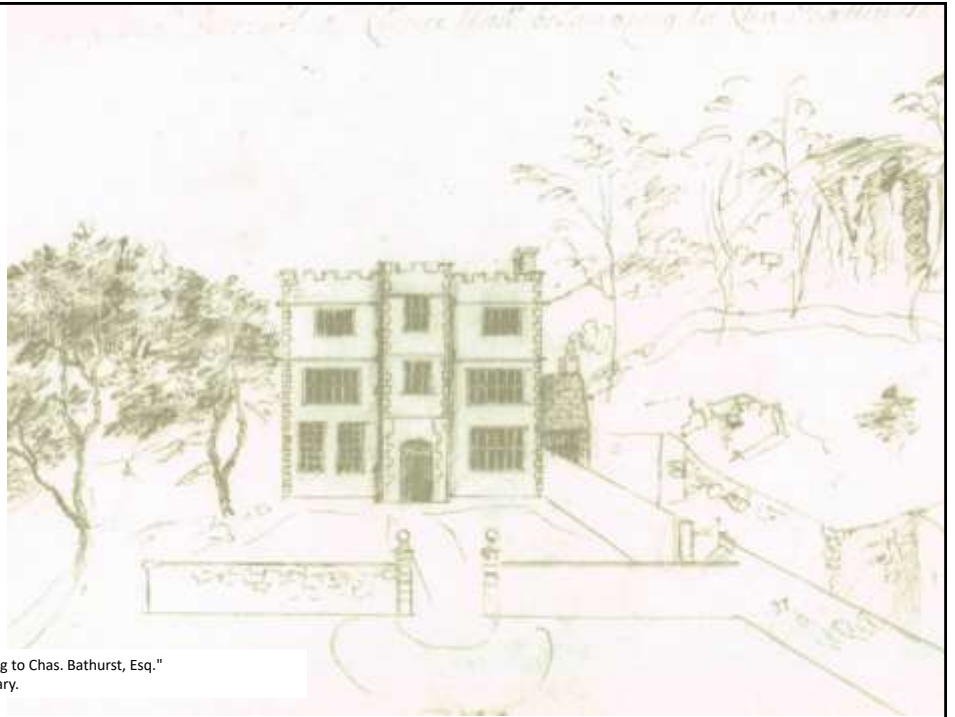

## Clints Hall: c1720

- It is likely that the Elizabethan Clints Hall was built by Robert Willance
- Willance was a draper and Alderman of Richmond

- **Married into Willances**
- **John Bathurst**
- **Great Grandson Charles**

## Clints: 1759

- **Errington family bought estate around 1800**
- **Irish Catholic**
- **Son George became "Coadjutor Archbishop of Westminster".**

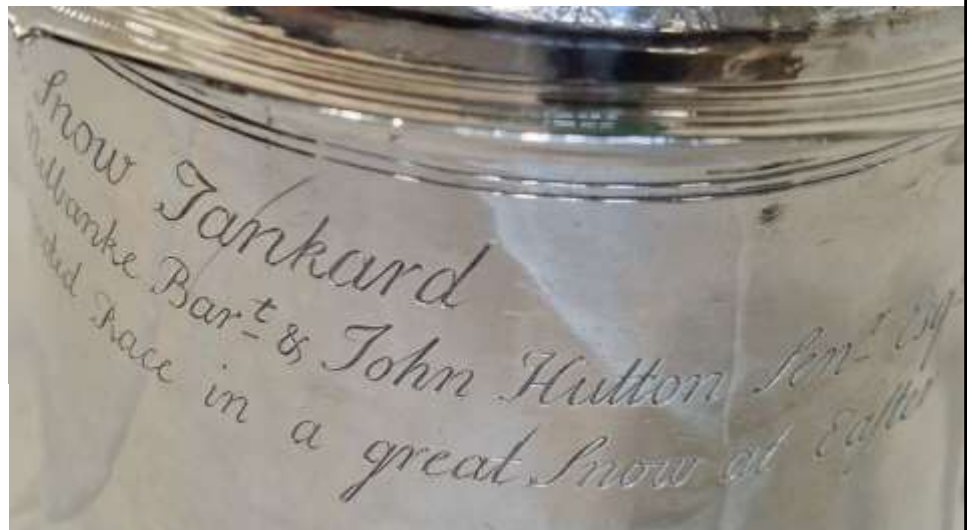
## The Snow Tankard: 1755

- **Winter in April  
1755**

- Won by Sylvio – a Hutton horse
- Early example of a neo-classical silver race cup.
- Family silver sold in 1987
